Documenting stories of family life in the context of HIV, hepatitis B or hepatitis C

What does family mean to you as a person living with HIV, hepatitis B or hepatitis C?

Or are you a family member of someone with one of these infections?

We want to interview people who are happy to talk about how they have involved family members in their health decisions and practices. We also want to interview family members of people with HIV, hepatitis C or hepatitis B.

We are using the term 'family' broadly, to include partners, parents, children, siblings and extended family, as well as families of choice, affinity, or intimate connection.

We hope this research can improve understanding of how families experience and manage blood-borne infections, and how services can better meet their needs.

If you are interested and eligible (which we will check by asking you a few questions first), you will be asked to take part in a confidential 1–2 hour interview at a time and place of your choosing, and will be offered a \$40 gift voucher as reimbursement for your time and contribution.
