


There were 1,013 new diagnoses of HIV in Australia in 2016. This has remained stable for the past five years.

The HIV notification rate has **increased** in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people over the past ten years. In 2016, the HIV notification rate in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people was **2.2** times greater than that of non-Indigenous people.






A late HIV diagnosis means that a person has been living with HIV infection for four years or more before being tested.

In 2015-2016, more than half of people living with HIV who were born in a high HIV prevalence country were diganosed late.

An estimated 11% of all people living with HIV in Australia were unaware of their HIV status in 2016.

An estimated **86%** of people diagnosed with HIV were on treatment in Australia in 2016.
